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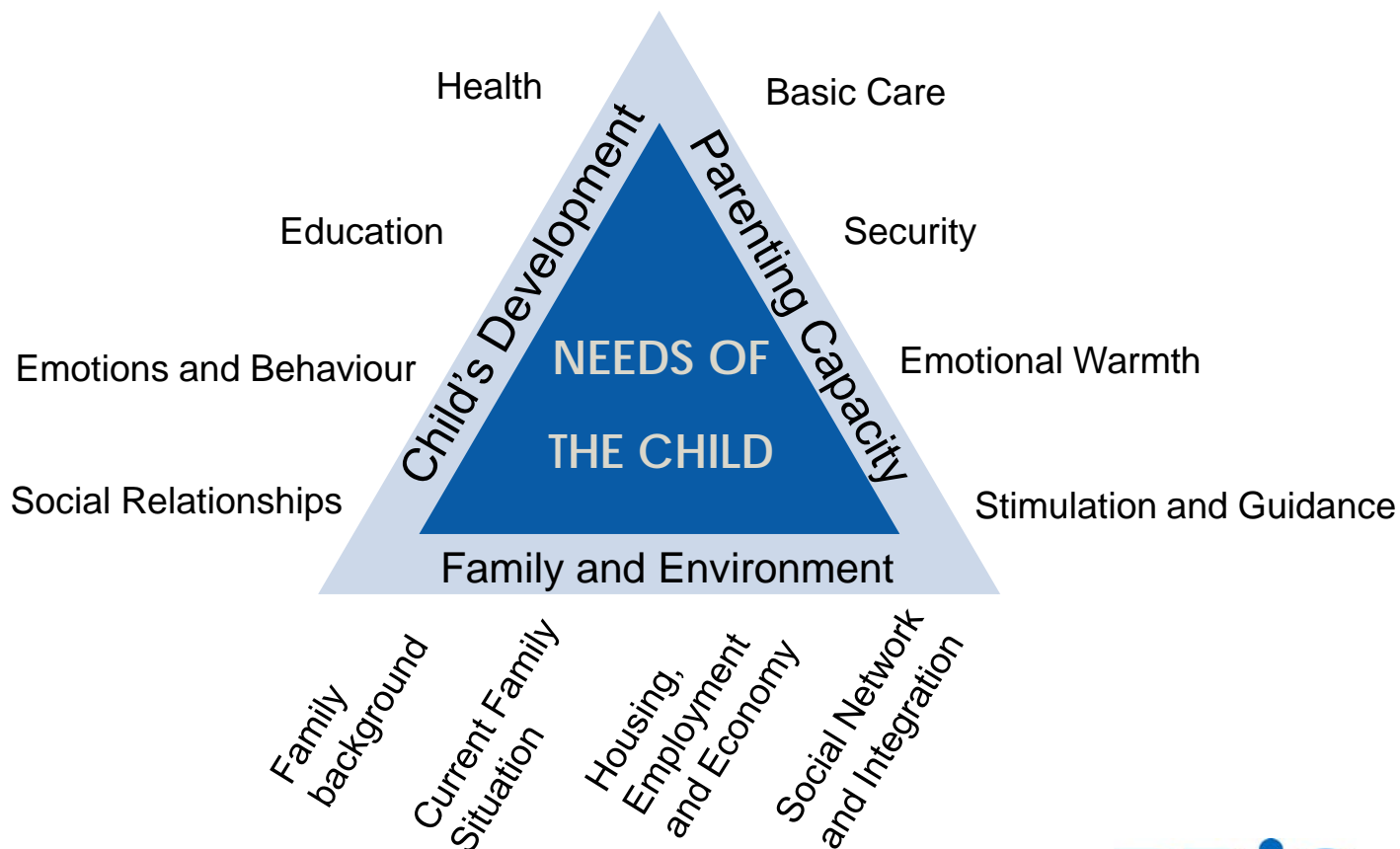
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# BBIC's overall vision and purpose

# Principles and objectives

- Involve every child and young person and his or her family during the whole process
- Seek and record the views of every child and young person in all processes that affect them
- Involve and cooperate with other professionals around the family
- Transform Swedish legislation and CRC into practice
- BBIC promotes an Evidence Based Practice (= research and best practice + experiences from professionals + views and information from child and parents)
- Provides a national equivalent structure for information handling and systematic follow-up
- Also supports systematic follow up on an overall level

# Well-liked and widespread process

- Implemented in 98 % of the municipalities (284/290) and is used for:
  - *Starting/initiating a child or young person's case*
  - *Assessment*
  - *Decision making*
  - *Planning of care*
  - *Follow up*
  - *Closing*

# The National Board of Health and Welfare is responsible for:

- Granting BBIC-licenses to those municipalities that wish to practice BBIC
- Education to local BBIC-trainers (normally especially appointed and experienced social workers) and local BBIC-responsible persons (often front line managers)
- Quality assurance and updating of the model
- Meetings for the national network of regional BBIC-coordinators (at least 4 times a year)
  - *The regional BBIC-coordinators support and stimulate the implementation of BBIC at regional and local level*
