# Wikipedia

- No reinventing the wheel required
- Potential benefits with the Wiki outweigh the risks
  - Can't be used as a promotional tool, but that protects the content.
  - Well established Wiki framework means all content has to be digested and neutral before it becomes an article.
  - Enforced community ownership means anyone can update and add information at any time.
  - Everything is possible, it just needs the right approach and planning - and a core group to facilitate the birth
- A solid communication plan is necessary, and training
